F.A.Q Policy Overview

Drop Off and Pick Up

- Drop off time is 9:00 A.M. for all camps.
- Pick Up time for Busy Bees is 1:00 P.M.
- Pick Up time for Camp-To-Come-To is 3:00 P.M.
- Pick Up time for Free To Be is 3:30 P.M.
- Pick Up time for Teen Camp is 4:00 P.M.
- For continuous lateness up to 15 minutes, a \$15 fee will be charged.

Pick Up Procedure

- Please sign out your child on their clipboard.
- Photo ID is required to pick up your child.
- When you register, please ensure that you list 2 alternate Authorized Pick Ups.
- Early Pick Ups needs to be before 2:45.
- For the safety of all our campers, please go to the front desk for early pick-ups and a Director will assist in getting your child to you.
- Parents are not allowed to roam the camp grounds to find their child.

Medical Forms

- Please submit a current medical that is within the past 24 months.
- Medicals and Emergency Contacts are due June 1st.
- If you register after June 1st, medicals must be submitted 3 full business days before your child's first day of camp.

Medications

- All medication, including, inhalers, must be submitted to the Camp First Aider.
- Your physician must complete a Medication Administration Form.
- All medicine must be in its original, sealed bottle/box with the child's name printed on the prescription.
- Medication cannot be expired.

Communicable Diseases

- Campers must be healthy, injury-free and well enough to participate fully at activities.
- Please keep sick campers home to avoid germs and illnesses being spread to other campers and staff.
- Campers must be symptom-free (i.e. fever, vomiting, diarrhea) for 24 hours before they return to camp.

Allergy Protocol

- We are a Peanut/Tree Nut Aware facility because of our many allergies.
- We do not allow Peanut/Tree Nut Products at camp.
- This includes anything that is processed or made in a facility that handles these allergens.
- Counselors will inspect lunches each morning.

Potty Training

- All campers must be Potty Trained.
- If a camper has a bowel-movement accident, the parents will be called to pick up the child.
